

With cooler weather right around the corner, now is the time to start winterizing your plumbing. Your pipes may be susceptible to the drop-

ping temperature this winter. Here are a few ideas to help you avoid winter mishaps:

Before the cold arrives:

- Disconnect outside water hoses. This can prevent the water inside them from freezing and causing pipes in your home to burst.
- Turn off inside valves to each outdoor faucet. Once valves are shut off, go to the outdoor faucet and drain any remaining water.
- Insulate pipes in areas that may be exposed to the cold, such as crawl spaces, attics or garages.
- Seal leaks that allow cold air inside near where pipes are located.
- Heat tape can be used to wrap pipes. Follow all manufacturers' instructions.
- Detach and remove any backflow preventers. Cap the ends of the irrigation system pipes.
- Drain all the water out of the irrigation system, or contact a professional to have the water removed.

When it turns cold:

- A trickle of water might be all it takes to keep your pipes from freezing. Let water drip overnight.
- Open cabinet doors to allow heat to get to pipes under sinks.

Before you leave:

- Keep your thermostat no lower than 55 degrees (F).
- Ask a friend or neighbor to check your house daily to make sure it's warm enough to keep pipes from freezing.



If your pipes freeze:

- If you turn on your faucets and nothing comes out, leave the faucets turned on and call a plumber.
- Never try to thaw a pipe with a torch or other open flame. Water damage is preferable to burning down your house.
